FOREWORD

It gives me immense pleasure to present the Annual report for the year.I take this opportunity to thank our Project in charge for his whole hearted support and cooperation in execution of all home activities and overall homely atmosphere of the home. I would also like to thank the staff of RFI without whose guidance and cooperation we would not have such an eventful period. Lastly I would like to thank my co workers and the home team members and all the committee members for their active participation in all home activities and proper conduct of every event/activities within and outside the home.

General status of Children

During this period we have totally 111 children admitted in our home. We have fourteen new admits in our home.Lot of scrutiny and evaluation was done before the admission of these children. We have adhered with the guidelines given to us by the RFI team and CWC.All the children inclusive of new children are positioned in different classes as under

Maximum of these children are day scholars in different government and government aided schools and colleges, we have around 7 children studying in Telangana State residential school and 24 children are staying and continuing their education in KGBV

NUTRITION CARE

With the onset of new period and the monsoon season the home management team along with the food committee as well as other committee members evaluated the food intake of all the children. A detailed feedback process was conducted for all the children responses and based on these responses a concrete future course of action

was taken. Firstly all the children were divided into three categories such as those who are nourished, malnourished and under nourished.

No of normal children onset of the period = 95

No. Of malnourished children onset of the period $12_{old} + 4_{new} = 16$

In order to improve the well being of the malnourished and food expert and doctors advice was taken in order to get the desired results in the given time frame.

We did have changes in the menu planned and executed for the malnourished children. The first step taken was deworming of these children as well as all the children So as to improve the food intake capacity for the children. Lot of sprouts with additional milk, seasonal fruits, and extra egg have been given to them. The food committee and home team along with older children seen to it these children take proper nutrition.

One major finding during the review meeting was that some children were not eating the vegetables, The food committee member as well as the home staff oversees the food intake of all the low eaters in our home. Considerable success has been achieved by taking up this activity as those children who are low food takers have started eating better..

During the start of this period we did have 16 malnourished which includes 4 new girls also. They were referred to the physicians. The home team and the food committee members are now focusing on their diet intake includes Ragi Malt, Anganwadi Nutritious food, Milk and lot of vegetables. All the children at home are being given eggs thrice a week compared to twice as in past. Rice Vegetable curry, Butter Milk and curd form a part of their daily lunch and dinner. We do provide them chicken once a week and fruits are being given thrice in a week in our meetings, we focus on nutrition and the importance of taking balanced diet for children and home mothers oriented accordingly. These meetings are focused on intake and calorific value of each vegetable and other food items. The children understood the purpose of taking balanced diet for a healthy body and good health.

HEALTH CARE:

As the period began with onset of rainy season the home health committee members took utmost precautions towards the health and safety of all our children. We commenced the period with deworming medicine give by Urban Health Care Centre officials during this period we had 45 children who were treated with different ailments like fever cold cough and skin allergy, these children were taken immediately to hospital to give necessary medical advice.

The health camp was held on 10/07/2017 at the Anganwadi Centre for skin allergies and skin diseases. The children were shown how to up keep their skin by the staff.

On 21st August a total health checkup. We did have two health check up camp. We had the general health camp by the Urban Health Centre Doodhbowli for our children. The children were given training on correct hand wash and skin protection in rainy season.



The children were taken to Osmania Dental Hospital for a complete Dental Check on 2/9/2017. . 5 children were given dental treatment for tooth decay and tooth fillings.

We conducted a blood test and blood groups of all the children of our home too on October 9th and 14th.

EDUCATION

With the commencement of new academic year the educational coordinator and home teachers planned for the improvement of children in academics with the support of Care Plans for the year. The problem areas in their school curriculum were identified. They visited periodically went to the schools to speak with teachers with regard to problems faced by our children and also improvement in the subjects.

The 12 children are currently undergoing bridge course at our home. These children will be admitted to regular school on completion of the course our home teachers took extra care of these children in giving the basic foundation in all subjects

We have appointed full time residential teachers Ms.Lakshmi and Ms.Shravanthi to teach our home children. We also have mandatory study hour in morning and evening for all our home children supervised by our home teachers. We do have a volunteer teacher for computers. Mr.Satya the computer teacher comes 4 days in a week to train our children in computers and also our home teacher Ms.Shobha also takes practical and theory classes for all our children in computers. The children have shown a lot of interest in learning the concepts as well as working on the computers. We are presently refurbishing the computer lab with inclusion of more new systems so as to help all our children in practice and learn to operate computers themselves. Our home staff oversees the practical classes.

New Methodology and Initiatives: All the members of our home team have additional responsibility of taking care of weak children after their office hours. Every day One of our non boarder's staff stays back on the designated day of their choice and oversees the children's education.

LIFE SKILLS

Program was conducted by the RFI TEAM at Satyodayam by Ms.Jaya. She emphasized on the need to motivate these children for group living and also their responsibilities as a good citizen when they grow up and start living in the society. A lot of time was spent on budget and earnings for the children.

We at home have put all these learning from the trainings in a much better way to inculcate changes in their life. Our staff conducts this programmetwice in a month. We do conduct lot of role plays and usage of audio visual aids in trying to reach out to all older children with regard to future planning, motivation, time management, discipline and hard work, Risk Behaviour, Career Mapping etc, For smaller children we conducted life skills on Bhavana Bazaar, Trust, Friendship, River of Life, When I am Sixty and Me Mine and Myswlf.

In all our home children we have found certain changes which are very evident compared to last period. Children are helping and participating in different activities at school and home is worth to mention.

EXTRA CIRRCULAR ACTIVITIES

We are continuing with our talent mentoring recognition for over all development of the child with the help of extra-curricular activities. The cultural and arts and crafts committees and the older children along with the home team encourage all our children to take part in some form of extra cultural activities. These participations have helped many children to get awards and recognition of their talent at their respective school level competitions.

ARTS:

The children of our home show lot of keen interest in learning new arts. These children do spend their time in getting new ideas and put into practice. Presently we are having Drawing,Painting,Singing, Dancing and theatre. Ms.Sumalatha along with our older children conduct these training sessions to our children.Our older children learn from internet new designs and new formats and teach our younger children. Some of our children have shown remarkable improvement and have won awards for their talent in inter school competitions.

CRAFTS:

Presently we are conducting classes in embroidery, Fabric Painting, Paper Cutting designs. We seek donor support to supply them with material used for training and practice of crafts to our children. Some children have mastered the art of creating greeting cards and other gift items using waste and new material available at home. We intend to show case their achievement and seek their help in buying these articles.

SPORTS AND GAMES

The Sports Committee and the home team see to it that all our children take part in some form of sports and games. The children play Kho-Kho, Caroms, Throw Ball, Chess and Snake and Ladder etc. The day begins with compulsory participation of Yoga sessions which are being held at home. We have seen improvement in their



overall personality. Apart from children having access to learn sports and games in our home,

These children are also participating in various inter school competitions and have won medals for themselves. M Priyanka, Kalpana&Swathi in wrestling, J Deepika&Swathi in Kabadi, SriLalitha and Kaveri in Kho-Kho

Outings and Exposure visits

We at our home plan outings and exposure visits such that the children are exposed to what is happening in the outside world as well as recreation and change from their day to day routine. On September 13 we took our children for Play to grow a gaming zone for children with donor support the children enjoyed playing many virtual and real games. On 20th September the children were taken to view SPYDER a telugu movie. The Afzalgunj Police Station Staff took our children to watch a movie Shaanu in Kumar theatre in Kachiguda.



During this period we conducted lot many exposure visits to different places of importance. One such visit was for Afzalgunj Police Station. The children interacted with the staff and got first hand information on how the police work. We wish to continue the exposure visits to different places like Banks, Post Office, Railways, and Hospitalsetc to give our children on how they work.



CHILDREN PARTICIPATION AND LEADER SHIP:

Children are made to participate in all home activities. To oversee the participation of all the children, we have formed different committees which are responsible to conduct of different duties and activities which are taken by the respective committees. We have 11 different committees. Three children are nominated in this committee. We do change the members of the committee periodically so as to give all the children a chance to take up the leadership role.

We also have 6 clubs these clubs namely Sports, Art & craft, Laughing, Itinerary, Gardening and cultural. They meet twice weekly and review the activities. These club activities are mandatory for all children and help each other in learning,

We are continuing the practice of 3 sisters group which is very closely knit group of one older girl with two young ones. There are 28 such groups. The older girl has the responsibility of grooming the young ones. This group gives them the much needed platform for getting groomed and taken care of the emotional care.

We have seen remarkable changes in the children who have actively participated in club and committee roles. They have been appreciated in their respective schools too

for taking part in different school programmes and activities. Most of these girls have won medals and appreciation certificates in their schools too. We wish to continue this practice and groom all the children at our home.

OLDER GIRLS FUTURES Ms Nagamma and Ms. Sneha, from Futures department, from state office have been allocated to take care of the careers of older girl and their future. We also had staff training on older girl futures. Our staff is also actively involved in counseling and finding right courses for older children to take up ad prepare them for group living after they leave home. Presently we have 16 older girls who will be joining different job oriented short term courses in computers, spoken English and tally. Our staff has mapped their requirement and is looking out for suitable part time jobs for them where in they will be able to continue their education and financially support themselves.

CELEBRATIONS AND FESTIVALS

Lot of religious and National festivals was celebrated with gaiety fun and frolic during this period. The period began Bonalu, Ganesh chathuthri, Ramzan, Bakrid, Bathkamma and Diwali. National festivals like Independence Day Teachers Day, Ghandhi Jayanthi and Children's day

INDEPENDENCE DAY CELEBRATION:

This year the Independence Day celebrations started with our home children participating in freedom march which was held on 12th August at People Plaza at Necklace Road?



At our home level too we did have flag hoisting by the Circle Inspector of Afzalgunj Police Station and his team had come and spoke to the children the importance of this day and what steps should be taken. On 15th August the children were invited by Bhagath Singh Youth association to participate in the independence celebrations. Our children performed the skit and School Kits were given to them by the chief Guest International Table Tennis Player Naina Jaiswal.



BATHKAMMA AND DUSHERRA FESTIVAL CELEBRATIONS:

Our home children celebrated the bathkamma festival on 28th Sep. 2017. They made a beautiful bathkama decorated with lot of flowers and danced and sang around it. The children really enjoyed and participated actively. Even the small children of our home came forward and danced and sang to bathkamma festival songs. The children decorated the home with rangoli and wore new clothes for Dusherra festival.



ENGAGEMENTS WITH FAMILIES

Once in three months we had parents meeting. During these meetings we call all parents and guardians and care takers of some of our children who do not have both the parents. During these meetings we speak to them and show case the improvement in the children/ward performance both academically as well as in terms of personality development and in home activities. During this period, we had one such meeting in July. Some of the parents/guardians were very happy to accept that their children had successfully passed the 10th class. We also shared with them the success and failures of their children and how we wish to work to the care plans which were given by their child.

Apart from the regular update of their child's performance we do speak to them of their vital responsibility in bringing up of their other children.

BUILDING SOCIAL PERSPECTIVE

The home team, management did draw out plans for activities for children to participate in different events which help the children to be aware of various problems in our society and the need to highlight them and make a beginning to fight against social evils in our society.

SUMMER CAMP CLOSING CERMONY:

The one month long summer camp closing ceremony was held on 10th June. The children showcased talent acquired in the summer camp very beautifully. The chief guest Shri K V Reddy CI of Afzalgunj PS addressed the children and encouraged them to learn new arts so as to be the best in the society, He reminded them that they are as good as other children and they could excel in all spheres of life. The children presented dances, skits and songs. We at home encouraged new children to take part in all the cultural events.



WORKSHOP ON CHILD MARRAIGES AND TRAFFICING: A 2 day workshop was organized by MAHITHA a NGO where in they had invited all the NGO's to participate in the workshop which was held on evils of child marriages and child trafficking both in our state as well country for our staff. The work shop highlighted how child trafficking and child marriages are being held in our society. The precautions to be taken to avoid the occurrence of the same in our own society.

CHILD ABUSE: A one day program was conducted by NGO- BHAROSA at our home premises on 14th July. The program highlighted on various forms of child abuse both sexual non sexual. They showed the differences between good and bad touch and how to differentiate and situations happen them. They also shared how to fight and whom to report for help when they see such in the society.



WORLD ENVIRONMENT DAY; On June 5th our staff and 5 of our children had participated in the world environment day program held at Narayanamma Engineering College premises. The program was organized by Babul film society. The program highlighted on the need to take up a forestation and steps to be taken to make a clean and green environment. All these was showcased with beautiful audio visual clips and talk by eminent speakers. The children also participated giving their views and suggestions on protection of environment from their end.

INTERNATIONAL CHILD LABOUR AGAINST DAY. A one day meeting was held at Press Club BasheerBagh, Hyderabad. All the NGO's as well as our staff took active participation in the program. The program highlighted on the evil of child labour and its different forms by which this is being put into practice both at our homes and society at large. Representatives from CWC, Labour Department and other prominent speakers addressed the gathering. They spoke about various steps to be taken in future to make our society child labour free.

ONE MILLION AGAINST ABUSE: On 9th and 10th September of 2017, a two day workshop was organized by CSA in Banjara Hills to highlight against the sexual abuse in our society. Our home children and staff participated in the program. The program showcased how and what are the reasons for the sexual abuse to happen and how small children fall a prey for this. The children also learnt what steps to be taken to avoid such abuses in their own lives.

PARTICIPATION IN RALLY: All Our children and staff participated in a rally from M J Market to exhibition grounds. The rally was on the theme NOT IN MY NAME. The children prepared placards in support of their rights and also against child abuse. The rally also was to create awareness on the remarkable work done by the Nobel peace prize winner Shri Kailash Sathywarthi. Latter in the evening the children participated in a cultural event titled BALLA HAKU DHOOM DHAM to spread the awareness of child abuse in our society at SuRYAVIDYAKENDRAM in baglingampally, Hyderabad

SELF DEFENCE IT'S IMPORTANCE: A one day training program on self defense and its importance was conducted by SUVIDHA to enlighten on the children on various forms of self defense and how to face life boldly when they are facing such problems in the society. The children were demonstrated various forms of self defense.

INTERNATIONAL GIRL CHILD DAY: Our home children participated in International Girl Child Day Program conducted by CWC in CESS, Punjagutta. Our children along with various other school girls participated in the program. The CWC Director Mr. Jagadishwerao and other prominent guests shared the day. They spoke on girl child and how one has to feel very proud of being a girl. They also shared on the achievements of some of



girls both in our state and country. The children were motivated and thrilled after attending this program

AWARENESS ON CRACKERS: A rally was conducted by our home highlighting the evils of crackers burnings during diwali festivals. The rally started from our home and ended at Charminar. The children prepared beautiful placards showcasing the evils of burning crackers during diwali festivals. The children also spread the message to society with regard to pollution and its health effects on both human beings and environment.



PROGRAM: AGAINST CHILD SEXUAL ABUSE: The Telangana State Police Department conducted a one day meeting on fight against child sexual abuse in people's plaza in Hyderabad. The meeting was held in a very lively manner with our children presenting a dance program to highlight the child sexual abuse and how to fight them. The IG Mrs. Charu Singha, DGP Shri Mahender Reddy and top film personalities shared their views on the topic. The meeting was organized with lot of video clips. The children were also given information on how to fight and whom to approach when faced with such situations.



RAINBOWHOME TEAM

We are presently 13 members in our team; eight members of our teams are residential. The non residential team members also take turns in staying back at night times to help the residential staff in children well being specially to oversee the educational progress of the children. Welcome our new staff namely Mr. Raju Home, Full Time Educational Teacher Shrvanthi and Lakshmi as Educational Coordinator and Manjula as Home Mother. Ms. Tulsi Bai is our new Social Mobilize. We would like to thank Ms. Madhavi our social mobilizer who has left our organization

TEAM TRAININGS: Our team has participated in different training programmes

EMERGENCY PROTOCOL: A two day training program was conducted for ARUN Home staff and SRD home staff on emergency protocol by Ms. Jaya from Amanvedikha Rainbow home. The training was on different steps to be taken during emergency situations in our home. The training was divided into Prevention, Pre Plan, Response and Recovery. The training was very beneficial as the participants understood the various aspects of handling emergency situations in our home. It also highlighted on whom to approach and how to approach them at such situations.

LIFE SKILL TRAINING: A four day training sessions was held from 24th to 27th October 2017 at Sathyadayam in Tarnaka for LIFE SKILL TRAINING. The training

highlighted on various aspects involved in upbringing 15 to 18 years children to mainstream of the society. Ms.Jaya spoke with regard to mindset of these children and various aspects involved in this age group of children. She also spoke on the aspirations, dreams, behavioral patterns and habits, She also spoke on the need to train these children in life skills as this would be very beneficial for them when their leave our home and start living an independent life in the society.

Ms.Jaya also trained us on life skills sessions to be conducted for children between the age group 9 to 14years. She also reviewed the progress made by us in dealing with these sessions at our home level.

TOT ON MANAGEMENT OF HOME; A TOT was conducted the proper management of home on November 3rd and 4th for two homes namely SRD and Arun Homes. Ms.Vimala conducted the sessions wherein she emphasized on proper management of the home. She highlighted on the importance of Safety and security for the children and the home staff. She also spoke on cleanliness and hygiene of the home and home children. She also gave us practical inputs on how to take care of children needs and how to cope up with stubborn and moody children.

FUTURES – MEETING:

On July 8th a training program was held for futures were held at Arun Home in Lalapet. where in the speakers from Reddys Foundation, Nirman and SRD trained our staff on what are the career opportunities for our children in job market and how to prepare them. How to select a course and on career guidance for our older children.

On 21.August.17 with regard to Futures Budget allocation and Futures program review and updates.the workshop was attended by our HMC and our futures coordinator. The workshop was attended by all rainbow homes. It was a good platform to understand what needs to done for the future for our older children. Accordingly we have planned and mapped different short term courses for our children. In order to help us in the execution of this programme the RFI is conducting twice in a month meeting to evaluate the progress and give valuable suggestions for the improvement.

VISITORS

Raja Singh – MLA –GoshamahallOur area MLA Shri Raja Singh is a regular visitor to our home. He spends time with our children and helps us in solving our problems.

V.K.Reddy – CI AfzalgunjP.S ,Saidulu SI : The circle Inspector and his team is also a regular visitor of to our home. He does come and motivates our children to be strong and study well and become good citizens of the country.

Ms.KHUSHAL PRIYA:She and her team from Bharosa an NGO working towards child safety, they conduct training sessions as well as group counseling for our children on various aspects concerning safety and being successful in life.

MS.J. PALLAVI – RED CROSS: Ms. Pallavi and her team visit our home and she was instrumental in getting the blood grouping for all our home children.

MD.ISHRATH – TELANGANA STATE HUMAN RIGHTS PROTECTION FORUM
MdIshrath and his team visit our home on periodic basis. They tell us our kids on various child rights and duties and how to protect one from getting exploited.

PRANAVI, MURTHI – SUVIDHA NGO:MsPranavi and her team visit our home and have done training sessions for all our children on self defense. They also help us in identifying the right candidates in mobilization across in the city.

DR PRASANNA – URBAN PRIMARI HEALTH CENTER: Dr. Prasanna spends some of his free and quality time in talking to children with regard to health and hygiene

JCI COMPANY OFFICIALS: The official representatives from JCI do come regularly to ourhome; they also have donated a water filter to our home

JAIN NARAYAN – LOCAL DONOR:Shri Jain Narayan is a prominent local donor who visits our home on periodic basis and enquires on home requirements. He has also donated lot many articles clothes, chappals, and other stationery requirements.

HARI PRASAD– LOCAL DONOR:ShriHari Prasad is a prominent local donor who visits our home on periodic basis. He has donated dresses, bags, shoes and other stationery requirements

MASS MEDIA The regional media come forward to share ourchildren participation in International Girl Child Day and also Police Department held program on child abuse at Necklace Road, Hyd.



LOCAL CONTRIBUTION

Our team is well aware without local support and cooperation our objective of bringing these children into main stream of our society will not be served. They are in constant touch with local as well as prominent personnel of our society. We seek their help for the proper well being of the children.

CHALLENGES

The weekly review meetings which are held in our office give us a platform to study and discuss the challenges which do come in our way towards keeping a homely atmosphere at our home. Some of the major challenges which we need to take up during the coming period are as follows.

PROVIDING GUIDANCE TO OUR CHILDREN, We have 15 children who will be writing their SSC board exam this year. We at home have mapped their weakness and strengths and providing all model papers and workbooks to prepare them. We have arranged special volunteer teacher to help them in their preparation

PROVIDING GUIDANCE TO OUR OLDER CHILDREN: We do have 2 intermediate first year and 7 intermediate 2nd year girls who will be taking their final examination this academic year. We have arranged subject volunteer teachers to train them.

REPLACEMENT OF DRAINAGE PIPES. We have periodically overflowing of pipes, many complaints have been given to the Sewerage department to repair and replace them with new ones which will be permanent solution.

CAREER GUIDANCE AND JOB PLACEMENT FOR OLDER GIRLS: In total we have 9 children who will be completing their 12th class. We are constantly speaking to them and finding their interest in what they would like to do in future. We have planned for them to join in short term job oriented courses in Computers, Tally and spoken English such that they would get jobs and start new life.
